**Holy Land Pilgrimage**

keeping you informed of where we shall be during the trip.



**Thursday 13<sup>th</sup>** After the flight, on to hotel in Bethlehem.

**Friday 14<sup>th</sup>** We visit the Nativity Church, the birthplace of Jesus Christ, celebrate Mass in St Catherine's Basilica. Then, on to the Grotto of St. Jerome and Milk Grotto and the Shepherd's Field. In the afternoon, we visit Ein Karem, the birthplace of John the Baptist, to see the church that commemorates his memory. Then walk up the hill to reach the Visitation Church.

**Saturday 15<sup>th</sup>** In the morning, we visit the Western (Wailing) Wall and Mount Zion, the Upper Room (of the Last Supper), Tomb of King David and Church of Dormition of Our Lady, then walk to the Church of St. Peter in *Gallicantu* (cock crow), the house of Caiaphas the High Priest where Jesus was held for a night after he was arrested. We move on to the of the Mount of Olives, to the Ascension Chapel, the *Pater Noster* Church where Jesus taught the Lord's Prayer to his disciples and enjoy the panoramic view of the old city of Jerusalem. We walk through Palm Sunday route to reach *Dominus Flevit* Church where Jesus wept over the fate of Jerusalem. On to the Garden of Gethsemane for Mass in the Basilica.

**Sunday 16<sup>th</sup>** We travel to Bethany (here Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead) and celebrate Mass before visiting the tomb of Lazarus. Then, back to Jerusalem to walk the Stations of the Cross on the *Via Dolorosa*, to reach the most sacred place for Christians, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre to visit Calvary and the Lord's Tomb. Then, on to visit St. Anne's Church where the parents of Virgin Mary lived, nearby view the Pool of the Bethesda.

**Monday 17<sup>th</sup>** We proceed through the *Judean Wilderness* to ancient Jericho, the oldest inhabited city in the world. Mass will be celebrated in the Church of Good Shepherd. Then go to the top of the ancient *Tel* (mountain) for a beautiful view of Elisha's fountain, the Mount of Temptation and later we will see the Sycamore Tree. On to Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found.

**Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup>** We travel to Emmaus where the Risen Jesus met the two disciples and shared a meal with them. Then, we visit the River Jordan for a Renewal of Baptismal Promises, onto Nazareth and Mass will be celebrated here. We then make our way to Tiberias (Galilee) and check-in to the Hotel.

**Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup>** An early morning boat ride across the Sea of Galilee. On to the Mount of Beatitudes for Mass at the scene of Jesus' great Sermon on the Mount. We drive to the site of multiplication of loaves and fish, *Tabgha*, and continue on to the Church of St. Peter's Primacy. Up to Caesarea Philippi, where Jesus asked: "Who do you say I am?" "You are Christ, the Son of the living God," replied Peter.

**Thursday 20<sup>th</sup>** To Magdala for Mass and then make our way to the airport to join the flight back to Manchester.
